

The Undersea Rainbow



I am thinking of a place. It is a natural beauty spot. It is found off the coast of Australia. It is bigger than the Great Wall of China, and you can see it from space.

Have you guessed the name of the place yet? That's right: the Great Barrier Reef!

The Great Barrier Reef is a living thing. In fact, it is the largest living thing on the planet; it is even bigger than Japan! It is made up of many corals stuck together.

A coral is a tiny sea creature which creates a hard shell for itself. Corals have been growing on top of one another for many millions of years, slowly building the vast structure that we see today. The Great Barrier Reef stretches 2,600 km along the warm, shallow water off the coast of Australia. It is like a huge, living wall of coral.

Punctuation Marks

★ There are many different punctuation marks.
↑ The comma has many uses:
To separate things in a; Example: I went to the shop and bought eggs, cheese, and milk.
To put into a full sentence; Example: My teacher, Mr. Jones, is from Wales. The dog, which is so cute, likes to play games.
To join two with connectors; Example: I like to eat apples, and Sue likes to eat bananas. This is a very big city, but it has no cinemas.
When writing and Example: Pam wants to visit her grandma in London, England. My little sister was born in June, 2012.
↑ The semicolon is used to join two without connectors. It must have a full sentence before and after it. Example: It is very cold; I must wear my gloves. I like to eat apples; they taste very nice.
The colon is used to list or name something or someone. It must have a full sentence before it, but does not need a full sentence after it. Example: She has one sister: Mary. I have three hobbies: singing, dancing, and playing the guitar.
