

Writing an Advertisement

- An advertisement is a kind of persuasive writing.
- The purpose of **persuasive writing** is to convince readers to do or think something. In **advertisements**, we attempt to persuade people to buy something.

Example: Use Brighty Toothpaste for shiny white teeth!

- Advertisements can be about toys, movies, gadgets, vacations, or anything else that you can buy!
- Advertisements speak directly to readers. This means that they are written in the second-person.
- An advertisement must describe the product using strong adjectives.
- It must also give reasons for why readers should buy the product.
- An advertisement must have:
 - ✓ a title;
 - ✓ a slogan;
 - ✓ an eye-catching image.





Do You Remember 🎉

- A phrasal verb is a combination of a verb plus an adverb or a preposition.
- A phrasal verb has a different meaning from the original verb. **Example:** "I ran into my grandma at the shops this morning."

run + into = meet unexpectedly

Some phrasal verbs are separable.

Example: "Ella <u>threw</u> the trash <u>away</u>."

Some phrasal verbs are inseparable.

Example: "The police are <u>looking into</u> this problem."
